Monday

You have searched me and known me, O God. You know when I sit down and when I rise up. (Ps 139:1-2)

Silence

Be still and aware of God's presence within and all around.

Opening prayer and thanksgiving

Scripture Readings

Psalm 138

- 1 I will give you thanks, O Lord, with my whole heart: even before the gods will I sing your praises.
- 2 I will bow down toward your holy temple and give thanks to your name: because of your faithfulness and your loving-kindness, for you have made your name and your word supreme over all things.
- 3 At a time when I called to you, you gave me answer: and put new strength within my soul.
- 4 All the kings of the earth shall praise you, O Lord: for they have heard the words of your mouth;
- 5 And they shall sing of the ways of the Lord: that the glory of the Lord is great.

- 6 For though the Lord is exalted, he looks upon the lowly: and he comprehends the proud from afar.
- 7 Though I walk in the midst of danger, yet will you preserve my life:
 you will stretch out your hand against the fury of my enemies, and your right hand shall save me.
- 8 The Lord will complete his purpose for me: your loving-kindness, O Lord, endures for ever; do not forsake the work of your own hands.

Luke 14:12-14

¹² He said also to the one who had invited him, 'When you give a luncheon or a dinner, do not invite your friends or your brothers or your relatives or rich neighbours, in case they may invite you in return, and you would be repaid. ¹³But when you give a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, and the blind. ¹⁴And you will be blessed, because they cannot repay you, for you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous.'

Silence

Reflect on the gospel and remember that God is with those who are poor and betrayed.

Intercessions

Scripture readings

Psalm 139:1-18

- 1 O Lord, you have searched me out and known me: you know when I sit or when I stand, you comprehend my thoughts long before.
- 2 You discern my path and the places where I rest: you are acquainted with all my ways.
- 3 For there is not a word on my tongue: but you, Lord, know it altogether.
- 4 You have encompassed me behind and before: and have laid your hand upon me.
- 5 Such knowledge is too wonderful for me: so high that I cannot endure it.
- 6 Where shall I go from your spirit: or where shall I flee from your presence?

- 7 If I ascend into heaven you are there: if I make my bed in the grave you are there also.
- 8 If I spread out my wings towards the morning: or dwell in the uttermost parts of the sea,
- 9 Even there your hand shall lead me: and your right hand shall hold me.
- 10 If I say 'Surely the darkness will cover me: and the night will enclose me',
- 11 The darkness is no darkness with you, but the night is as clear as the day:
 the darkness and the light are both alike.
- 12 For you have created my inward parts: you knit me together in my mother's womb.
- 13 I will praise you, for you are to be feared: fearful are your acts, and wonderful your works.
- 14 You knew my soul, and my bones were not hidden from you: when I was formed in secret, and woven in the depths of the earth.
- 15 Your eyes saw my limbs when they were yet imperfect: and in your book were all my members written;
- 16 Day by day they were fashioned: and not one was late in growing.
- 17 How deep are your thoughts to me, O God: and how great is the sum of them!
- 18 Were I to count them, they are more in number than the sand:

 were I to come to the end, I would still be with you.

Luke 14:15-24

15 One of the dinner guests, on hearing this, said to him, 'Blessed is anyone who will eat bread in the kingdom of God!' ¹⁶Then Jesus said to him, 'Someone gave a great dinner and invited many. ¹⁷At the time for the dinner he sent his slave to say to those who had been invited, "Come; for everything is ready now." ¹⁸But they all alike began to make excuses. The first said to him, "I have bought a piece of land, and I must go out and see it; please accept my apologies." ¹⁹Another said, "I have bought five yoke of oxen, and I am going to try them out; please accept my apologies." ²⁰Another said, "I have just been married, and therefore I cannot come." ²¹So the slave returned and reported this to his master. Then the owner of the house became angry and said to his slave, "Go out at once into the streets and lanes of the town and bring in the poor, the crippled, the blind, and the lame." ²²And the slave said, "Sir, what you ordered has been done, and there is still room."

²³Then the master said to the slave, "Go out into the roads and lanes, and compel people to come in, so that my house may be filled. ²⁴For I tell you, none of those who were invited will taste my dinner."

Silence

Reflect on the gospel and on the Christ of the cross, suffering in the world with all those who are broken.

Intercessions

O Christ of the road of the wounded, O Christ of the tears of the broken, in me and with me the needs of the world. Grant me my prayers of loving and hoping. Grant me my prayers of yearning and healing.

Pray for the coming day and for the healing within and among all people.

Scripture readings

Psalm 146

- 1 Praise the Lord, praise the Lord, O my soul: while I live I will praise the Lord;
- While I have any being:
 I will sing praises to my God.
- 3 Put not your trust in princes: nor in flesh and blood, which cannot save.

4 For when their breath goes from them, they return again to the earth:

and on that day all their thoughts perish.

5 Blessed are those whose help is the God of Jacob:

whose hope is in the Lord their God,

6 The God who made heaven and earth:

the sea, and all that is in them,

7 Who keeps faith for ever:

who deals justice to those that are oppressed.

8 The Lord gives food to the hungry: and sets the captives free.

9 The Lord gives sight to the blind:

the Lord lifts up those that are bowed down.

10 The Lord loves the righteous:

the Lord cares for the stranger in the land.

11 He upholds the widow and the fatherless:

Luke 14:25-33

²⁵ Now large crowds were travelling with him; and he turned and said to them, ²⁶ Whoever comes to me and does not hate father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, yes, and even life itself, cannot be my disciple. ²⁷ Whoever does not carry the cross and follow me cannot be my disciple. ²⁸ For which of you, intending to build a tower, does not first sit down and estimate the cost, to see whether he has enough to complete it? ²⁹ Otherwise, when he has laid a foundation and is not able to finish, all who see it will begin to ridicule him, ³⁰ saying, "This fellow began to build and was not able to finish." ³¹ Or what king, going out to wage war against another king, will not sit down first and consider whether he is able with ten thousand to oppose the one who comes against him with twenty thousand? ³² If he cannot, then, while the other is still far away, he sends a delegation and asks for the terms of peace. ³³ So therefore, none of you can become my disciple if you do not give up all your possessions.

Silence

Reflect on the gospel and on God as the wellspring of all life.

Intercessions

Scripture readings Psalm 147

- O praise the Lord, for it is good to sing praises to our God: and to praise him is joyful and right.
- 2 The Lord is rebuilding Jerusalem:

 he is gathering together the scattered outcasts of Israel.
- 3 He heals the broken in spirit: and binds up their wounds.
- 4 He counts the number of the stars: and calls them all by name.

- 5 Great is our Lord, and great is his power: there is no measuring his understanding.
- 6 The Lord restores the humble: but he brings down the wicked to the dust.
- 7 O sing to the Lord a song of thanksgiving: sing praises to our God upon the harp.
- 8 He covers the heavens with cloud, and prepares rain for the earth: and makes the grass to sprout upon the mountains.
- 9 He gives the cattle their food: and feeds the young ravens that call to him.
- 10 He takes no pleasure in the strength of a horse: nor does he delight in anyone's legs,
- 11 But the Lord's delight is in those that fear him: who wait in hope for his mercy.
- 12 Praise the Lord, O Jerusalem: sing praises to your God, O Zion.
- 13 For he has strengthened the bars of your gates: and blessed your children within you.
- 14 He makes peace within your borders: and satisfies you with the finest wheat.
- 15 He sends his command to the earth: and his word runs very swiftly.
- 16 He gives snow like wool: and scatters the hoar-frost like ashes.
- 17 He sprinkles his ice like morsels of bread: and the waters harden at his frost.
- 18 He sends out his word and melts them: he blows with his wind and the waters flow.
- 19 He made his word known to Jacob: his statutes and judgements to Israel.
- 20 He has not dealt so with any other nation: nor have they knowledge of his laws. Praise the Lord.

Luke 15:1-10

¹Now all the tax-collectors and sinners were coming near to listen to him. ²And the Pharisees and the scribes were grumbling and saying, 'This fellow welcomes sinners and eats with them.'

³ So he told them this parable: ⁴'Which one of you, having a hundred sheep and losing one of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the wilderness and go after the one that is lost until he finds it? ⁵When he has found it, he lays it on his shoulders and rejoices. ⁶And when he comes home, he calls together his friends and neighbours, saying to

them, "Rejoice with me, for I have found my sheep that was lost."

⁷Just so, I tell you, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous people who need no repentance.

⁸ 'Or what woman having ten silver coins, if she loses one of them, does not light a lamp, sweep the house, and search carefully until she finds it? ⁹When she has found it, she calls together her friends and neighbours, saying, "Rejoice with me, for I have found the coin that I had lost." ¹⁰Just so, I tell you, there is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner who repents.'

Silence

Reflect on the gospel and on the One who calls us to follow him as the way, the truth and the life.

Intercessions

Life be in my speech, truth in what I say. The love Christ Jesus gave be filling every heart for me. The love Christ Jesus gave be filling me for everyone.

Pray for the coming day and to follow Christ more closely.

Psalm 148

- 1 Praise the Lord, praise the Lord from heaven:
 - O praise him in the heights.
- 2 Praise him, all his angels:
 - O praise him, all his host.
- 3 Praise him, sun and moon:
 - praise him, all you stars of light.
- 4 Praise him, you highest heaven:
 - and you waters that are above the heavens.
- 5 Let them praise the name of the Lord:
 - for he commanded and they were made.
- 6 He established them for ever and ever:
 - he made an ordinance which shall not pass away.
- 7 O praise the Lord from the earth:
 - praise him, you sea-monsters and all deeps;
- 8 Fire and hail, mist and snow:
 - and storm-wind fulfilling his command;
- 9 Mountains and all hills:
 - fruit trees and all cedars;

10 Beasts of the wild, and all cattle:

creeping things and winged birds;

Luke 16:1-8

¹Then Jesus said to the disciples, 'There was a rich man who had a manager, and charges were brought to him that this man was squandering his property. ²So he summoned him and said to him. "What is this that I hear about you? Give me an account of your management, because you cannot be my manager any longer." ³Then the manager said to himself, "What will I do, now that my master is taking the position away from me? I am not strong enough to dig, and I am ashamed to beg. ⁴I have decided what to do so that, when I am dismissed as manager, people may welcome me into their homes." ⁵So, summoning his master's debtors one by one, he asked the first, "How much do you owe my master?" ⁶He answered, "A hundred jugs of olive oil." He said to him, "Take your bill, sit down quickly, and make it fifty." ⁷Then he asked another, "And how much do you owe?" He replied, "A hundred containers of wheat." He said to him, "Take your bill and make it eighty." 8And his master commended the dishonest manager because he had acted shrewdly; for the children of this age are more shrewd in dealing with their own generation than are the children of light.
