



HOLY WEEK

On this Sunday at the beginning of Holy Week we hold together the triumphal entry into Jerusalem and the death of Christ, bringing into sharp relief the speed at which events turned from joy to pain, from acclamation to humiliation, from companionship at the Last Supper to isolation on the Cross.

The liturgy begins outside by the cross and we process into the church which is decorated with palm branches. The hymns, the anthem, the readings, particularly the reading of the Passion and Death of Jesus taken from the Gospel of Luke, are chosen to help us enter into this Holy week.


In your imagination, see if you can enter into the story of the Passion... Be there as Jesus gathers with his disciples and shares the bread and wine. Be there at the Mount of Olives when Jesus knelt down and prayed in anguish. Be there when they led him away and taunted him. Be there when face to face with Pilate. Be there with the shouts of the crowds saying 'crucify him!'. Be there when he hangs on the cross and dies. Be there when they laid Jesus in the tomb.

We know the end of the story, but to sit with the pain, the loneliness, the deep sadness is to enter into our human story also; our personal story and the story of many of our brothers and sisters around the world.

Yes, the end of the story is a transforming one! There is hope! There is light! There is the enduring Love of God which was there all through the life and teaching and passion of Jesus! Do you know that? Do you know that?

As the body of Christ on earth, we can through our 'transformation' bring hope and light and love to others.

READINGS

Isaiah 50.4-9a

The Lord God has given me the tongue of a teacher, that I may know how to sustain the weary with a word. Morning by morning he wakens - wakens my ear to listen as those who are taught. The Lord God has opened my ear, and I was not rebellious, I did not turn backwards. I gave my back to those who struck me, and my cheeks to those who pulled out the beard; I did not hide my face from insult and spitting. The Lord God helps me; therefore I have not been disgraced; therefore I have set my face like flint, and I know that I shall not be put to shame; he who vindicates me is near. Who will contend with me? Let us stand up together. Who are my adversaries? Let them confront me. It is the Lord God who helps me; who will declare me guilty? All of them will wear out like a garment; the moth will eat them up.

Philippians 2.5-11

Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness. And being found in human form, he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death - even death on a cross. Therefore God also highly exalted him and gave him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.
