READINGS

Job 38.1-7

- ¹ Then the Lord answered Job out of the whirlwind:
- ² 'Who is this that darkens counsel by words without knowledge?
- ³ Gird up your loins like a man,

I will question you, and you shall declare to me.

- ⁴ 'Where were you when I laid the foundation of the earth? Tell me, if you have understanding.
- ⁵ Who determined its measurements—surely you know! Or who stretched the line upon it?
- ⁶ On what were its bases sunk, or who laid its cornerstone
- when the morning stars sang together and all the heavenly beings shouted for joy?

Psalm 104.1-10, 26

Hebrews 5.1-10

- ¹ Every high priest chosen from among mortals is put in charge of things pertaining to God on their behalf, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins.
- ² He is able to deal gently with the ignorant and wayward, since he himself is subject to weakness; ³ and because of this he must offer sacrifice for his own sins as well as for those of the people.
- ⁴ And one does not presume to take this honour, but takes it only when called by God, just as Aaron was.
- ⁵ So also Christ did not glorify himself in becoming a high priest, but was appointed by the one who said to him,
- 'You are my Son,

today I have begotten you';

- ⁶ as he says also in another place,
- 'You are a priest for ever,

according to the order of Melchizedek.'

- ⁷ In the days of his flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to the one who was able to save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission.
- ⁸ Although he was a Son, he learned obedience through what he suffered; ⁹ and having been made perfect, he became the source of

eternal salvation for all who obey him, ¹⁰ having been designated by God a high priest according to the order of Melchizedek.

Mark 10.35-45

³⁵ James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came forward to him and said to him, 'Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you.' ³⁶ And he said to them, 'What is it you want me to do for you?' ³⁷ And they said to him, 'Grant us to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your glory.' 38 But Jesus said to them, 'You do not know what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup that I drink, or be baptized with the baptism that I am baptized with?' 39 They replied, 'We are able.' Then Jesus said to them, 'The cup that I drink you will drink; and with the baptism with which I am baptized, you will be baptized; 40 but to sit at my right hand or at my left is not mine to grant, but it is for those for whom it has been prepared.' 41 When the ten heard this, they began to be angry with James and John. 42 So Jesus called them and said to them, 'You know that among the Gentiles those whom they recognize as their rulers lord it over them, and their great ones are tyrants over them. 43 But it is not so among you; but whoever wishes to become great among you must be your servant, 44 and whoever wishes to be first among you must be slave of all. ⁴⁵ For the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many.'

A Message from Jenifer McKenzie

Dear Friends at St.Paul's Canterbury,

Last week I was so saddened to hear the news from the Bp of Upper Shire Malawi that Canon Fr Hopeson Jailosi (who we have supported in Malawi) has cancer of the liver. Hopeson is not yet 50 years old, when we were in Malawi, he showed himself to be such a promising leader in his parish and indeed the Diocese. I was particularly impressed by the way he empowered the women in his parish to make decisions and to take responsibility for them. Two years ago he was sent to a very poor parish and St Paul's helped very generously to finish building the parish house which had been stationary for so long due to lack of funds.

You may remember that we have also helped him with funds to gain a degree which he sent a photo in his robes receiving his degree at the university there.

I have been in a dilemma as to whether I should ask, as there has been so much lately, and this may well be a lost cause, however after last Sunday's sermon when we were reminded that actions are more important than words, I felt I had no choice but to try to help.

There is no radiotherapy treatment in Malawi or an MRI available the only Oncologist in the country does not have the facilities to do efficient biopsies, but the Oncologist believes Hopeson's only chance is to go to India for treatment, this is the cheapest option from Malawi. One or two parishes in UK are trying to raise funds, 3 days treatment in India will cost \$700 US dollars, I am hoping and praying that I can find 15 people myself included who will give \$50 each to at least get Hopeson the 3 days of the estimated 2 weeks treatment that he requires.

Please pray for Hopeson (his name means he is the son of hope) and please help if you can.
